18 February 2009

A procedural note from John Connolly, VP for BSG Affairs: As per the quorum specified in the BSG Constitution, BSG requires 2/3 of its voting membership to be present in order to convene an actual meeting and conduct business such as approval of the minutes and voting on resolution. As many members of the BSG were in the final rehearsal of the Vagina Monologues (opening the following night), this meeting did not initially have 2/3 members present. The agenda was thus followed in an "informal discussion" and all actual voting and procedural business was completed once members returned from the rehearsal.

Informal Discussion: John- we're getting started, hopefully two more people will come.

I. President's Welcome: 8:34-John- welcome everyone. Sam- YOU'RE NOT THE PRESIDENT.

II. Public Comment Time: Ross is here for public comment time- Thanks for funding 3 speakers for Peucinian. I talked to Jason today, and a few other people, and a very famous public intellectual named Camille Paglia wants to come to Bowdoin. She's ranked high in public speakers in the world. Alan Delong was excited for about 30 seconds about this. She's controversial. I really want to get her here. Sophia said BSG might want to help with publicity and maybe even money. She's a lot of things (he reads a nice list of her qualities). She was a big sixties leftist, but then she became concerned with the way the university was heading. She's one of the few thinkers who's found a way of reconciling academic thinking with sexual liberation (hits table for emphasis). I think there's a need to hear what she has to say.

Questions:

Sam- What would she talk about exactly?

Ross- For the past 8 years, proving the last administration was a failure has made the campus more intellectual. Now we wonder where we go from here. She will give a speech on the politics for a liberal education that reconciles the noblest academic traditions with sexual liberation. I've talked to GWS and English departments and they're interested in teaming up with us.

John- Did you already go to SAFC?

Ugo- No I told him to come here first because for a speaker like this it seemed like a

good idea to have a BSG stamped approval on it. Would be nice to have the BSG supporting it.

Justin- BQSA will support it.

John- Cost?

Ross- She's one of the most popular intellectuals in the country. She e-mailed us saying we can make her an offer resembling what we've given similar people. I think she might come for between 5k and 10k. If we got a nice base of funding from one place, other departments would pitch in.

Mike- Timeline?

Ross- Friday in April.

Sam- there's common hours every Friday in April.

Ross- She's insane enough that she might be interesting during ivies.

Rutledge- That's what I was thinking.

Carly- My only fear is that drunk people are bad at getting from one place to the next. Even if they intend to go there, will they make it?

Rutledge- Put her on the bandstand!

Ugo- Do you think you could start the bidding at 2-3 and she if she would accept that before getting up to 10?

Ross- I think we can start at 4k. We paid cornell west 40k.

Ugo- The school paid, not us.

Christian- Any downside to starting lower?

Ross- 4k is the lowest respectful amount.

Sam- It's a slap in the face to start off to low.

Ugo- if we start with 3k and make a good argument (the money's from students not administration), that might work. As long as we explain the reasoning.

Sam- Either way, I think this body is behind the idea, but first we need to know how much SAFC and other departments can pay and how much she really wants.

Ross- So maybe I'll come to the SAFC next Monday?

Ugo- We need a full body.

Carly- Informal opinion vote?

Ross- I'm going to the SAFC next Monday, can I ask about it? Do guys have questions about the Peucinian society? We're inclusive! Last Thursday we talked about international institutions. Before, we talked about whether we should liberate humans from gender. We had a BQSA leader against a leader of CSU.

III. Committee Reports:

a. BSG Affairs Committee: John says- we've set dates for elections and those are: BSG officer elections done the week before ivies and class council will be the weekend after ivies. We're moving it up about a week from last year and won't hit reading period. And we updated union calendars.

b. Student Activities Funding Committee: Ugo- money's good. Sam- how good? real

good? Ugo- pretty good.

c. Student Affairs Committee: Carly- no advances in health center survey and we're working on the Union thing. Also, health and wellness fair is tomorrow, make sure you attend! 11-3 in the union. 30 different boothlike things

d. Student Organizations Oversight Committee: chartered Q magazine and another thing.

e. Academic Affairs Committee: Sam- library advisement committee met up to talk about study carrels and how they're reserved. And credit/d/fail group met last Friday and we're meeting again this Friday to hopefully get something for the faculty.

f. Facilities Committee: Mike- we came up with a gender neutral housing resolution but we're still revising. I know there were a lot of heated opinions last week, so please come talk to me if you have ideas. And we talked about some sustainability stuff.

a. Movie Tickets: Mike- we need movie tickets, but we can't vote tonight. We keep selling out of tickets. I'm thinking about raising ticket prices so that we get more money. Right now, I buy for 7 we sell for 5. Money is dwindling (John says allocated money is gone). My thought is that we raise price to 7 so that we break even and we can sustain.

- Sam- Ugo were you saying that the SAFC could help fund in some way?
- Ugo- if we charge 7, how much do they save?
- Sam- couple bucks.
- Ugo- this is the one thing we have to show the student body that we're doing something.
- Mike- I beg to differ.
- Carly- raising it to 7 makes it more of a hassle than it's worth.
- John- how's the 2 ticket policy?
- Mike- there's been a couple issues (class to opera and proctor group). I think it is being enforced for the most part, especially during the day. On the whole I'm pretty happy.
- Justin- can we talk to the Brunswick taxi people to extend their Cook's corner times so that people can get to the movie theater more cheaply?
- Mike- the thing is that in the past we've had a movie theater shuttle, but it's hard because of movie times. My thought is that if you want to see a movie you can take the night taxi or a regular taxi. I don't think we should do that. It would have to be really efficient with a really detailed schedule.
- Carly- I agree with Justin that if we can't afford it we should just own up to it.

- Sam- but we can get the money.
- Mike- if we raised the price, there would be info to the student body about why.
- John- as far as our budget numbers, we don't have money in the movie ticket pot, but we're saving money in other areas. No webmaster, secretary gets paid less (WOAH NOT COOL) [because she hasn't received the Bowdoin minimum semester increase like our previous secretary has], and less money to facilities because of the different rooms we've been using for meetings. Also things that will be coming up- Hannah's leadership training and Nalgene. I think we should subsidize movie tickets.
- Esther- aren't students saving money either way?
- Jack- let's just break even and students will still be happy.
- (witty banter between Christian and Nile)
- Ugo- come to SAFC and ask. If we say no, come back to the BSG.
- Rutledge- also, watch for typos and on the BSG newsletter.
- Kristen- and the font!

b. C/D/F- Sam- I'll try not to bore you since this has been going for 2 years now. It's not the time to do anything radical because we won't vote on it and with last year's change we still don't know how it's working. Possible changes- the D, the deadline, whether profs should know, how many, and whether you can use it on a fifth course. I'd like to go through them quickly and see what you guys think. Let's start with privacy- whether profs should know which students are taking credit/d/fail.

- Rutledge- I don't think they should know, it should be up to the students. Just like admissions- need-blind. It will affect the way profs view the student.
- Kristen- regardless of how you're taking the class, it might affect the way a prof grades your papers. One of my friend's profs used to just write "credit" on her papers. That's not a good enough level of feedback.
- Carly- profs just won't think that you're taking the class seriously. I don't see a reason for it.
- Sam- devil's advocate- for classes with group-work, it's hard when some kids are credit/d/fail and others aren't.
- Carly- if you're taking credit/d/fail and its obvious in your work, then the prof should be able to tell. I think it's the prof can tell that you're slacking off—it doesn't really matter why.
- Rutledge- I don't buy that argument.
- Ian- my impression is that the majority of people who take c/d/f take the class less seriously.
- Rasha'- I don't have a real position, but to make the case better we need a poll or something to get student's issues.
- Sam- we have a little bit of a poll going down now.

- Nile- in response to Ian, even though students might in general not care as much about a class, there's no value to the prof to know that it's because they're taking it c/d/f.
- Carly- groupwork doesn't happen very frequently and usually you don't have THAT much to do. Doesn't seem like an issue.
- John- in Spanish we do a lot of groupwork and I have been with c/d/f kids and they feel bad if they're not contributing.
- Christian- how many people have had classes with people taking it c/d/f who are slacking off?
- Ugo- I just thought the person was stupid.
- Kristen- maybe this is just based on my focus in ES where there's a lot of groupwork, but we had evals where we said how much work we thought we put in. I think c/d/f kids are honest on those evals.
- Ian- profs might think that a c/d/f kid doing poorly just doesn't care, whereas he/she would reach out to a kid taking it for a grade who was doing badly.
- Sam- okay next question is about the D. What do people think?
- Nile- I think the D should be there because I feel like you would really have to not be doing your shit to get a D.
- Mike and Rutledge, almost in unison- I got a D, it's all good.
- Rutledge- I just wish that the faculty would come to terms with the grade/credit/fail. I think kids would try harder.
- Mike- I think at times the difference between a C- and D is up to the professor. I think the D shouldn't be there.
- Carly- I feel like that kind of comes into the whole thing where if the prof knows that you're taking the class c/d/f, they might just give you a D if they don't like you or something.
- Justin- What are the numbers?
- Sam- 60-70, 70-80, 80-90...
- Ugo- I know we talked about doing more research, and I think someone said something about Brown's system.
- Sam- Brown- you can take as many classes you want c/d/f for your major or not.
- Christian- prof gives you letter, you decide plus or minus.
- Ugo- can we see how their administration feels about their student's achievement?
- Sam- Yes.
- Christian- Nile what do you think is gained by keeping the D?
- Nile- I think on some level, it's the difference between a kid taking the class c/d/f because they're interested but not sure if they're good vs. a kid taking the class who doesn't care at all.
- Jack- how does credit affect your gpa?

- Sam- it doesn't. The next question is deadline. I think the major question is 2 weeks (end of add/drop period) or 6 weeks (which it is now).
- Mike- I think that most people don't sign up for a class planning on c/d/f-ing it, they decide after they get a feel for their classes. I think that 6 weeks gives you a better chance at getting a feel.
- Carly- I think that since we only have 4 c/d/fs, then it's not fair to only give 2 weeks to decide if it's worth it. Yes, we're thinking about grades, and only giving it 2 weeks will make it harder to gauge.
- John- most c/d/f classes don't count toward your major. If you take a class your freshman year and then decide you want to major in it a few weeks in, with a 2 week deadline that's just not fair.
- Esther- why's there a deadline?
- Sam- you would be able to manage your grades too much.
- Rutledge- if the whole idea behind c/d/f is exploration, then why can't we use it toward distribution requirements?
- Sam- not getting into that now.
- Justin- can't use it for major, minor, or distribution.
- Nile- 6 weeks policy would be way better. Personal example, philosophy is hard as balls but I thought I would be good at it.
- Emma- distribution requirements- sometimes those are someone's weakness and we should be able to credit/d/fail those.
- Sam- unfortunately that came up last year and we voted against it.
- Christian- 2 week is also too short because what if you switched into a new class.
- Rasha'- I think we need some type of mechanism to convince the faculty to agree with us.
- Rutledge- you're in a fantasy land.
- Christian- profs WILL listen to you.
- Sam- I think part of the problem is that we shouldn't be thinking about it as an us vs them battle.
- Rasha'- I see this as a neverending debate that won't get us anywhere. I think we lack research. We need research to back up our points. Psychological study.
- Sally- the key with faculty relations is compromise. Pick our fight.
- Justin- let's move on since we can't vote on anything.
- Sam- email me if you have any (chant from hall- VAGINA VAGINA VAGINA) suggestions.
